
UMECRA received a proposal from Purina regarding continuation of their sponsorship. As in previous years, this would be another 2 yr. sponsorship.

GRAZING MANAGEMENT DURING DROUGHT

Much of Kentucky has been behind on rainfall since spring began, but the drought has been exceptional in Western Kentucky with some cities 8 and 9 inches below normal rainfall totals. With some of the state's historically driest months ahead, good pasture management is critical for livestock producers, said forage extension specialists from the University of Kentucky (UK) College of Agriculture.

One of the easiest things producers can do to ensure their animals get the most use out of their forages is

to practice rotational grazing. In a rotational grazing system livestock graze in one area for a limited time before being moved to another area. This gives forages time to recover from grazing and ensures the animals use a greater percentage of the available forage.

"During a drought we can't afford to waste pasture, and rotational grazing permits us to use more of what we grow and waste less," said Garry Lacefield, UK forage extension specialist.

Many of Kentucky's pastures are full of cool-season grasses including tall fescue, orchardgrass, and Kentucky bluegrass. These pastures are the least productive during hot, dry weather. If producers install some warm-season perennial grass pastures into their rotational grazing system, it can help ensure their livestock have quality forages during the summer months. While it might be too late to install these grasses this year, producers might want to consider establishing them in the future.

Another option for producers is to incorporate pastures containing alfalfa or alfalfa-grass mixes into their grazing system. Alfalfa tends to have a deep root system, which makes it more drought-tolerant than other cool-season legumes and grasses, and alfalfa will continue to produce while other cool-season grasses go dormant during periods of extreme drought, Lacefield said.

According to Bob Coleman, PhD, PAS, associate director for undergraduate education in equine science and management and extension horse specialist, a warm-season option includes Bermuda grass for pastures in areas of the state where Bermuda grass will grow.

Additionally, Coleman recommends horse owners remove horses from pastures when grass has been grazed to a height of 4 inches. If re-growth doesn't reoccur in 21-28 days, he recommends horse owners designate a dry lot or sacrifice area to feed horses in until the pastures recover to 8 inches or more. While the sacrifice area sacrifice might not recover this growing season, it should be a small area for horse owners to renovate in the fall.

UK extension publications on rotational grazing, summer annuals, and extending the grazing season are available under the publications section on the UK forage website.

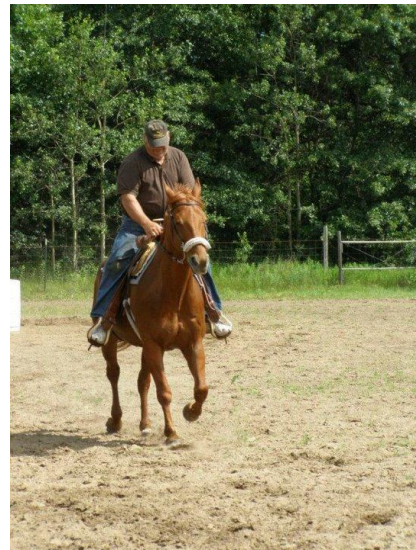

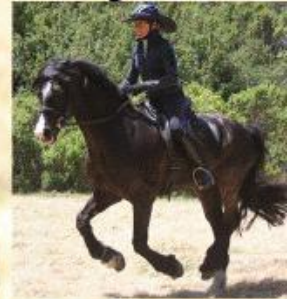

TEN TIPS TO KEEP HORSES COOL

The heat can play havoc with your horse's health. It can result in dehydration, lethargy, and general malaise. Severe heat stress can result in diarrhea and even colic. Janet Johnston DVM, Dipl. ACVIM, ACVS, an emergency critical care veterinarian at University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine's New Bolton Center, suggests the following ten tips to keep your horse comfortable and safe in the summer heat.

1. Choose your turnout times. If your horse has a stall but is turned out for part of the day, provide turnout during the cooler hours. Overnight is ideal, but if that's not possible, turnout as early as possible during the day.

2. Give him shade. If he lives outdoors or must be out during the day, provide relief from the sun. A run-in shed is best. Trees are a source of shade as well, but as the sun moves so will the shade.

3. Move that air. Fans are a great way to help keep the air moving in the barn, but use them wisely. Always ensure that your horse can't get a hold of cords and plugs.

4. Mist it. If you are lucky enough to have a system to mist your horse, use it. As the moisture is absorbed from your horse's skin, it will take away some of the heat as well. Frequent misting is more effective at cooling a horse than a single dousing with the hose.

5. Lead him to water. Make sure your horse has plenty of fresh, cool water. A bucket hanging on a fence will get too warm to be appealing to your horse. Left long enough water will also become stagnant and unhealthy. If you provide clean, cool water and your horse doesn't seem to be drinking, encourage him by providing a salt block.

6. Electrolytes. If your horse is sweating a great deal, water laced with electrolytes can help keep his body in balance. Whenever you offer electrolytes, however, be sure to offer fresh water as well. Too many electrolytes and too little water can be harmful.

7. Slow down the work. Just because your horse has been working intensely in the heat of the day doesn't mean he continue when the temperature tops 90°F. If you have to work him in the heat, lighten the work or break it up into a couple of short sessions. This is especially important when the humidity is high and contributing to the poor quality of the air he is breathing.

8. Stick to a schedule. Within the parameters of keeping him cool, try to stay as close as possible to his normal schedule. Too much change at one time can be an invitation for colic to develop.

9. White out! Horses, especially white or light-colored horses, can suffer from sunburn. Even those with white socks, blazes, pink noses, or hairless patches can be prone to sunburn. Using a fly sheet can help, and applying sunblock to small, particularly vulnerable areas can also be effective. Staying out of the sun's harmful rays will, of course, be best. (Also be aware: if a horse has excessive sunburn it could indicate a rare, underlying liver disease.)

10. Clipping horses with longer hair coats is important, especially those with Cushing's disease. While some coat can provide protection from the sun and insulation, a thick coat tends to hold heat in and make it difficult for the horse to cool down.

Hot Summer Tip: Pay Attention to Horse's Physical State

Summertime temperatures are running wild across the United States this week, with Oklahoma hitting approximately 105°F, which is leading a number of equine owners to study their horse's heat tolerance with more than a little caution.

"Other than a general lack of enthusiasm and desire to move to shade, a normal well-acclimated horse should be able to handle Oklahoma's heat and humidity with little concern," said Dave Freeman, Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension equine specialist. "However, the need for owner awareness increases when a horse begins to exercise and engage in more strenuous physical activity."

A horse's body temperature--if it is normally around 101°F--will increase a few degrees with exercise in hot summertime environments. If not exercising, a horse's heart rate should be around 40 beats per minute; respiration rate 12-20 breaths per minute,

though this is variable; and body temperature around 101-102°F.

Maximum heart rates during heavy exercise may reach 200 beats per minute or more, and respiration rates can triple or race even higher. Intense levels of work can raise a horse's rectal temperatures to 104°F, plus or minus, which for any substantial length of time will be harmful.

"This means that it is vital that the horse has the ability to decrease excessive body temperature quickly during recovery," Freeman said. "Otherwise, heat stress becomes a big concern."

Under most conditions, equine owners should expect a horse's major physiological measurements--heart rate, body temperature and respiration rate--to decrease dramatically within 5 minutes following heavy or prolonged exercise.

"A horse should reach characteristic 'resting values' within 10-15 minutes at the longest," he said. "If the horse is really 'hot' from exercising, recovery is best done by hand, walking the animal in an area with good air flow and away from direct sunlight."

Freeman explains that cooling the horse's body with water is recommended as long as the equine's heart and respiration rates have dropped to near 'resting value' levels, and possibly even sooner under critical heat stress conditions.

"Humidity and air flow causes evaporation; as a result, your horse may sweat more than you think," Freeman said. "That makes it especially important to pay attention to the animal's physical clues--its respiration rate, heart rate and body temperature--during times when your horse may be at risk from the heat."

If a horse does not appear to be producing sufficient sweat, the owner should contact his or her local veterinarian, who can quantify the animal's sweat rate and take appropriate action.

"Veterinarians have evaluation methods in which drugs are administered that cause a horse to sweat, and might even use absorbent pads to quantify losses," Freeman said.

Anhidrosis, or the inability to sweat, is a problem with a small percentage of horses, but one that should be diagnosed accurately so that an equine owner is able to determine the extent of use to which the horse can be put during periods of excessive summertime temperatures.
