# 2016 Rider/Horse Ages

I am always amazed at the resilience and longevity of our distance horses and their riders. At the end of the season, I like to average the ages of the Top Ten finishers in each division. Here are the results from the 2016 season (Rider Age/Horse Age):

L.D.: 57/14 End HW: 51/12 Comp. HW: 43/12 End LW: 57/14 Comp LW: 59/14

My intention in the following observations is not to be quoted as gospel or even taken seriously. Don't take offense anyone - just my input.

It is interesting to note that the youngest rider to finish in Top Ten was 23, but only one other rider was under the age of 30. There were only 2 riders over the age of 70, 78 being the oldest rider to finish Top Ten, but 20 riders in their 60's. Average age of the Light Weights was much higher that the Heavy Weights. Does that mean skinny, wizened up people last longer, as do their horses because they don't have to carry as much weight? Only 6 riders were men, 44 were women. What does that mean?

Oldest horse to finish Top Ten was 24, and I proud to say he was my own Bannarr. Only one horse was 5. Only 11 single digit aged horses were in the Top Ten, but 5 were over the age of 20. That says one thing to me – our horses last because we start them slowly.

So, here is what I glean from the results as far as the target for recruiting new riders. In general, the majority are women with children or families who have reached an age to be able to care for themselves while Mom goes off trailer racing and who ride good solid horses, even if past the age that most other competitive sports would consider them "old".

In conclusion, I would like to once again quote the late, great icon of our sport, Louise Reidel: "Old age and experience will outdo youth and enthusiasm any day." RIP my friend. I am sure where ever you are, you are watching us from atop a horse

Proposed bylaw changes from November BoD Mtg

Article VIII Membership Section 4.
TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP. The Board of Directors may by a majority of a quorum of the Board present vote to terminate the membership of any member who has been shown to have conducted himself or herself in a manner which is inconsistent with the goals and objectives of the organization. Thereafter such terminated member shall not be

entitled to participate in any corporate functions or other corporate activities in any manner whatsoever.

Article III, Section 7 (all new- adding to bylaws) Meetings of UMECRA shall be conducted to provide for fair discussion and deliberation in providing for constructive and democratic meetings, to help, not hinder, the business of the Corporation. While decisions shall be taken by the will of the majority, the rights of a minority to be fairly heard shall be provided. For that purpose, Roberts Rules of Order, newly revised, may be consulted to provide for an orderly process.

# PROCEDURES FOR UMECRA'S 2017 ANNUAL MEETING

- I. The agenda will follow the standard order of business
- II. Voting delegates and proxies will be identified
  - A. The Secretary will request that each ride report to the Secretary two weeks prior to the Annual Meeting who will be serving as the ride's voting delegates or proxies at the annual meeting
    - 1. Voting delegates and proxies will be given unique means of identification for the meeting
    - 2. The Secretary can approve or disapprove last minute changes in proxies before the annual meeting; the Secretary's decision may be appealed to the President, but the President's decision is final
- III. The meeting processes will be governed by the chair in a manner deemed by the chair to be the most efficient and effective.

  However, should controversies, disagreements or the need for more order arise, the chair will guided by Roberts Rules of Order for conducting the meeting

- IV. The chair will announce that only voting delegates or proxies can make motions and vote
  - A. The chair *may* invite comments and questions from the general membership and may limit the length of speaking time for each general member
  - B. No one should speak until recognized by the chair
  - C. All speakers are to stand and face the majority of the audience

# V. Motions

- A. Only voting delegates and proxies may make a motion
- B. All motions must be stated clearly. The motions will be recorded by the Secretary
- C. With few exceptions, motions must be seconded before being considered for comment or discussion
- D. The individual making the motion will be invited to speak first and provide reasons for the motion
- E. Motions are subject to amendment by any voting delegate or proxy and may be made by making a motion to amend
- F. The Chair may announce to limit or end discussion on a motion **or** a voting delegate or proxy may make a motion to "call or move the question" to end discussion and proceed to a vote.

  A motion to end discussion requires a two-thirds vote (this is because this action is limiting the rights of voting members to express their opinion on the motion).
  - 1. If a voting delegate or proxy objects to the chair announcing a limit for the time for discussion or announces the end of the discussion of a motion they must make their objection in the form of a motion to "call or move the

question". This motion must be seconded, discussed and then a voted on.

Two-thirds of the voting delegates and proxies are required to limit or end discussion of a motion or amendments to motions.

# VI. Voting

- A. Voting method is determined by the chair and include:
  - 1. Voice votes
  - 2. Raising of hands or paddles
  - 3. Counted raising of hands or paddles
  - 4. Counted Standing
  - 5. Roll call
  - 6. Paper ballot
- B. The Chair will determine and announce individuals assigned to count votes and to collect and count ballot votes, including those for elections
- C. A voting delegate or proxy may move for confirmation of the chair's determination of a voice vote and request an alternative method of voting; this motion must be seconded.
  If the chair agrees the alternative voting method will then proceed.
  If the chair disagrees, the chair will request a vote on the motion for an alternative method of voting.

# VII. Elections

- A. Officers and Board of Directors
  - Only voting delegates and proxies may nominate individuals and vote on Board of Director Officers and Board Members
    - a) Delegates and proxies from within the State can only nominate the State Director.
    - b) All Delegates and proxies are then able to vote for the nominee(s).

- a. See that motions are worded clearly
- b. Repeat wording of motions frequently
- c. Make the effects of amendments clear
- 5. Learn How to Conduct Voting

# **Voting**

# **Types of Votes**

- 1. **Majority\*** = More than half of the votes cast by persons entitled to vote, excluding blanks or abstentions. Whenever a majority vote of the Board of Directors is taken, it shall mean of the quorum present.
- 2. **Two-Thirds** = two-thirds of the votes cast by persons entitled to vote, excluding abstentions. Whenever a two-thirds vote of the Board is required, it shall mean of the entire Board whether voting or not.
- 3. **Majority of Entire Membership** = a majority of the total number of those who are members of the voting body at the time of the vote
- \*Note: A majority vote is different than a plurality vote, which is the largest number of votes (which may be less than a majority) when there are three or more alternatives. Under Robert's Rules of Order, a plurality vote is not sufficient. Re-vote to achieve a majority.

# Robert's Rules of Order Cheat Sheet HOW TO INTRODUCE NEW BUSINESS – The Main Motion Process

- 1 Member makes a clearly worded motion to take action or a position.
- •"I move..."
- •Motions recorded in minutes

#### 2 - Motion must be seconded.

- •"Second!"
- •A second allows discussion to occur; it does not signify approval.
- •A motion without a second does not move forward.

## 3 - Chairman restates the motion.

- •"It is moved and seconded that..."
- Provides clarity

#### 4 - Discussion/debate occurs.

- •Maker of motion starts discussion.
- •Ammendments may be offered return to step 1 to ammend motion: "I move to amend the motion by..."

# 5 - Chair closes discussion and states the question/asks for a vote.

- •"The question is on the adoption of the motion that..."
- •Motion repeated word-for-word

# 6 - Chairman provides voting directions:

- •"Those in favor of the motion, say aye";
- •"Those opposed, say no"

## 7 - Chairman announces the result of the vote:
